UNDER THE RADAR...

THE ROBBER (15)

In German with English subtitles

Based on '80s Austrian criminal sensation 'Shotgun Ronnie', **Benjamin Heisenberg's** tense, kinetic thriller follows Johann, a successful marathon runner who is also a compulsive bank robber.



SALVO (12A)

In Italian with English subtitles

Winner of the Grand Prix in last year's Cannes Film Festival, this ingenious arthouse gangster movie follows Salvo (**Saleh Bakri**) a cold and emotionless Mafia bodyguard, whose abduction of his enemy's blind sister causes him to question his existence as his feelings towards her grow.

A fascinating Japanese remake of Clint Eastwood's award-winning Western, with **Ken Watanabe** (Batman Begins) taking over the lead role as a once notorious samurai forced back into a life of violence having retired years before.

Matthew McConaughey won the Best Actor Oscar for his portrayal of a rodeo cowboy smuggling life-saving drugs across the border, whilst **Jared Leto** collected the Best Supporting Actor award for his role.
