THE TALES OF HOFFMAN (U)

A stunning restoration of Powell and Pressburger's dazzling take on Jacques Offenbach's opera, containing previously unseen footage. Released in 1951, the film stars Moira Shearer and Robert Rounsville as Hoffman, a university student who is spectacularly unlucky in love.



SECONDS (15)

The University Of Northampton's Cult Film Club present this unique drama from 1966, starring Rock Hudson as a jaded executive provided with a new face and lifestyle by a shady, multi-national corporation. He begins to feel trapped in his new life, but finding a way out is not nearly as easy as it was to find a way in.

INHERENT VICE (15)

Paul Thomas Anderson's new feature stars **Joaquin Phoenix** as a drug-fuelled private eye in 1970s Los Angeles.
