IT HAPPENED ONE NIGHT (U)

DAD'S ARMY (PG)

Bill Nighy, **Catherine Zeta-Jones**, **Toby Jones**, **Tom Courtenay** and **Michael Gambon** lead the cast of this comedy following the Walmington-On-Sea Home Guard. Set after the events depicted in the popular sitcom, the film sees the group on a mission to uncover a German spy.



THE REVENANT (15)

Leonardo DiCaprio gives an Oscar-tipped performance in this new feature from **Alejandro González Iñárritu** (*Birdman*) inspired by true events. In 1823 frontiersman Hugo Glass was brutally attacked by a bear and left for dead in the wilderness by members of his own hunting team. Nominated for eight BAFTAs including Best Film.

SNOOPY AND CHARLIE BROWN: THE PEANUTS MOVIE (U)

In this animated adventure based on Charles Schultz' best-loved characters, the hapless Charlie Brown tries to get The Little Red-Haired Girl to notice him, whilst Snoopy and Woodstock take on the Red Baron.

THE BIG SHORT (15)

Christian Bale, **Steve Carell**, **Ryan Gosling** and **Brad Pitt** star in this comedy drama based on true events, following a group of men who anticipated the housing and credit bubble collapse, and who decided to profit from the big banks. Nominated for four Golden Globes and five BAFTA Awards.
