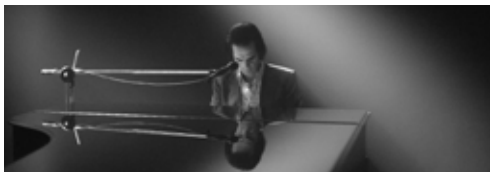

VALLEY OF LOVE (15)

In French with English subtitles

Nominated for the 2015 Cannes Palme d'Or, **Guillaume Nicloux's** drama is a poignant exploration of love and loss. **Isabelle Huppert** and **G rard Depardieu** play an estranged couple meeting for the first time in years after their son's suicide.
