SCREEN ANIME: A SILENT VOICE (12A)

In Japanese with English subtitles

This 1998 musical drama follows a young single mother trying to balance her personal responsibilities with her budding career as a musician. She decides to form her own all-girl Reggae group, but her world is turned upside-down when family tragedy strikes.



BABYLON (15)

Franco Rosso's 1980 drama was the first major British feature film to take Reggae music as its central theme, following the trials and tribulations of a young car mechanic and aspiring musician (**Brinsley Forde**) in South London.

GONE TOO FAR! (12)

Destiny Ekaragha's 2013 comedy follows a Peckham teenager who finds his street cred threatened when his long-lost brother arrives from Nigeria, with questionable fashion sense and a broad accent. Forced to spend the day together, the pair deal with local bullies, girl trouble and their African heritage.
